DIAL CONDUCTS WEEK OF PRAYER IN SRI LANKA

From June 18-July 2 this year, Dr. Joe and Mrs. Becky Dial traveled to the country of Sri Lanka (formerly Ceylon) in response to an invitation by Dr. Evangelyn Gahum, president of the Lakpahana Adventist College and Seminary

(LACS). During their first week in that country Dr. Dial conducted a Week of Prayer at LACS and in the second week they toured the country. His theme for the week was "Walking with Jesus." His sermons covered the following titles: "New Life in Christ," "Benefits of Following Jesus," "The Character of Jesus," "Enjoying Abundant Life in



Jesus," and "Preparing for the Return of Jesus." In his preaching, Dr. Dial was aware of the fact that about half of the students and faculty were Buddhists.

"10 THINGS EVERY MAN SHOULD KNOW ABOUT A WOMAN"

This was the topic shared by Dr. Joe Dial to the men's group during the Sabbath School time at the camping at Silverwood Lake on September 23. The ten things he enumerated were the following: (1) A woman needs recognition and affection, (2) A woman loves a man who helps at home, (3) A woman needs to be heard, (4) A woman easily changes moods and feelings, (5) A woman, while considered to be the weaker sex, actually has some strengths over men, (6) A woman has the gift of intuition, (7) A woman is stimulated by what she feels, not by what she sees, (8) A woman enjoys varied expressions of love, (9) A woman adjusts her point of focus on various stages of life, and (10) A woman delights to hear the three magic words "I love you." The rest of us should have listened to the discussion on the specifics of these observations about a woman. The overall goal was to promote harmony in the home.
